When I arrived at the Church to meet Brother JP, Mrs. Henderson was so kind to call her doctor, they were about to close in thirty minutes, she got me in ! She was a blessing. We went straight there, he gave me a shot to stop the swelling, put me on steroids and let me know how dangerous this was, and to go to a doctor immediately when I get home. Please make this a matter of prayer. I have been dealing with these hives for a full year, ever since I had my knees replaced June of 2015. I went to an allergist when I got home, she tested me for eighty different things, food allergies, ragweed, pollen, pets, everything. Came back in with the results, she stated this **BIG WORD**, I said, oh no, now what is that? She said it really means we don't know what the cause of this was. Please keep this as a matter of prayer. We are not talking about a few hives. I will wake up in the morning and be covered in hives. She said I must have caught something in the hospital stay while getting my knees done. As I write this letter, I just got off another cycle of steroids five days ago and I have hives back today. You're probably asking why I didn't seek medical help sooner. I would take Benadryl to knock them down. It stopped working and this emergency happened, it was time !

I also want to mention, I have another grandbaby, Brayden Hatch, in this picture, he is one month old, four total and loving it! I must say we have had some awesome revivals in the midst of all this. I was home four days in a six week period, doing revivals. I came home once in twenty four hours to leave again for a two week period. One service at Rev. Randy Tuckers, nobody wanted to end, lasting two hours. I've run out of room on this letter. Keep me in your prayers.
